There are more than 650 wineries, so join an organized tour or hire a guide to take you throughout one of the four sprawling wine zones of Mendoza. But Mendoza isn't just about wine. The region is a jumping off point for adventure and eco-travel, especially to Mount Aconcagua. There are also a number of large hotels, like the Park Hyatt Mendoza, and many intimate boutique hotels and wine lodges throughout the region.

A short flight from Buenos Aires to Mendoza exposes lovers to more than 650 bodegas, or wineries, or where you can luxuriate at a wine spa, like the Cavas Wine Lodge. 
