Skybrook

Skybrook offers memberships to non-residents and privileges at partner course, Charlotte Golf Links. The course is open to the public.



Mint Museum

The Mint is the largest art museum in the region, with three different sites housing its collection of fine arts and crafts.

Nascar Hall of Fame

NASCAR's Hall of Fame is right at home in "NASCAR Valley." The Charlotte area is home to seventy-three percent of NASCAR-related businesses. If you aren't into racing, take at least one trip to the Hall of Fame to witness one of I.M. Pei's many architectural masterpieces.

Blumenthal Performing Arts Center

This performing arts group manages a host of uptown theater and music venues including the Belk Theater and Spirit Square. Nationally-recognized performances like Wicked and the Lion King make stops at these venues.

The Levine Museum of the New South

A short drive to Charlotte will find you in this history museum focusing on life in the North Carolina Piedmont after the American Civil War. Within the building, enjoy excellent New Orleans-inspired American cuisine at restaurant E2, owned by Emeril Lagasse.

Billy Graham Library

Journey through history with one of the most influential voices of the 20th century. Through state-of-the-art multimedia exhibits, films, and memorabilia, you'll relive the historic moments of his life.

Daniel Stowe Botanical Garden

Located within 380 acres on the banks of Lake Wylie, spectacular gardens, sparkling fountains, a conservatory dedicated to the display of tropical plants and orchids, a visitor pavilion, gift shop and nature walk await the visitor.



Presbyterian Medical Center

Carolinas' Medical Center

CMC is a world class facility that offers a full range of services. It's campus includes the Levine Cancer Institute's academic and research headquarters, Carolinas Rehabilitation, and Levine Children's Hospital. It is the largest research hospital in the region and is a Medicare-approved transplant center in kidney, pancreas, liver and heart.

Lake Norman Regional Medical Center

This Mooresville Medical Center provides clinical care using advanced technology. The campus encompasses a 123-bed hospital, orthopedic specialty center, and outpatient surgery center, comprehensive women's center, a surgical center for weight loss, and four medical office buildings.
