NCU's unique approach to graduate education is ideal for self-starters and independent thinkers who want a premier education with

unprecedented flexibility. We use a unique one-to-one learning model that pairs one student with one doctoral professor for each course. Throughout their academic journey, students are mentored by professors who are experienced in their field of study. NCU professors hold doctoral degrees, and none of our programs have residency requirements, allowing flexible access to students no matter where they live.

Since launching in 2005 with just 15 students, NCU's Department of Marriage and Family Sciences has grown to serve more than 1,400 current students and alumni, who hail from 48 U.S. states, Puerto Rico and more than 10 nations.

NCU offers the first distance-based Master of Arts in Marriage and Family Therapy (MAMFT) program to be accredited by the Commission on Accreditation for Marriage and Family Therapy Education (COAMFTE). In addition, NCU's PhD in Marriage and Family Therapy is the first, and currently only, distance-based program to gain COAMFTE accreditation. This coveted programmatic accreditation ensures that the University's

programs align with national accreditation standards and licensure requirements in most states.*

We're very proud of the positive impact we have had on our students. Under the guidance of mentoring professors who are experienced, licensed therapy practitioners, our students acquire the knowledge, skills, practical application and values that help shape them into competent, ethical and culturally sensitive marriage and family therapists. In fact, according to the 2014 NCU Alumni Survey, 89 percent of respondents agreed or strongly agreed that their NCU program content aligned with their career objectives.

The success of our graduates tells us that our coursework is relevant and that our approach truly prepares them for the next step in their busy professional lives. I hope you enjoy learning more about what makes NCU's marriage and family therapy programs different and, quite frankly, remarkable.

In 2009, both NCU's Master of Arts in Marriage and Family Therapy and Doctor of Philosophy in Marriage and Family Therapy were approved by the Arizona State Board as stand-alone programs in family therapy.

DUPLEX MODEL

When an NCU marriage and family therapy student begins his or her local community practicums, they do so with the unparalleled support of NCU's Duplex Model of supervision.

In keeping with our mentoring approach to education, each NCU student receives primary support from qualified supervisors in their local clinical placement. Additionally, each student receives weekly secondary support via two-hour secure video conferencing sessions with NCU professors who are licensed family therapists and AAMFT Approved Supervisors or supervisor candidates. Groups of six students participate in these weekly sessions through a secure link to share questions, issues and cases to gain valuable knowledge and insights from one another and their experienced NCU clinical professor.





5:1 SUPERVISION RATIO

All students receive a minimum of one hour of supervision for every five hours of client contact. Students receive one hour of supervision each week with their local supervisors and participate weekly in a two-hour synchronous practicum/internship course with an NCU professor who is an AAMFT Approved Supervisor or supervisor candidate. All students will receive a minimum of 100 hours of supervision and 500 hours of client contact over a 12-month period.


