


"We have this false idea that there is uniformity in progress and that things change in one big step. Recent research shows a direct link between conservativism, the perception of African-Americans as violent and the likelihood of having a gun at home. "Specifically, for each 1 point increase in symbolic racism, there was a 50% greater odds of having a gun in the home, and there was a 28% increase in the odds of supporting permits to carry concealed handguns." -- "Racism, Gun Ownership and Gun 0.70 Control: Biased Attitudes in US Whites May Influence Policy Decisions"
