

“Kunstquartier Bethanien,” *Slow Travel Berlin*, December 2014



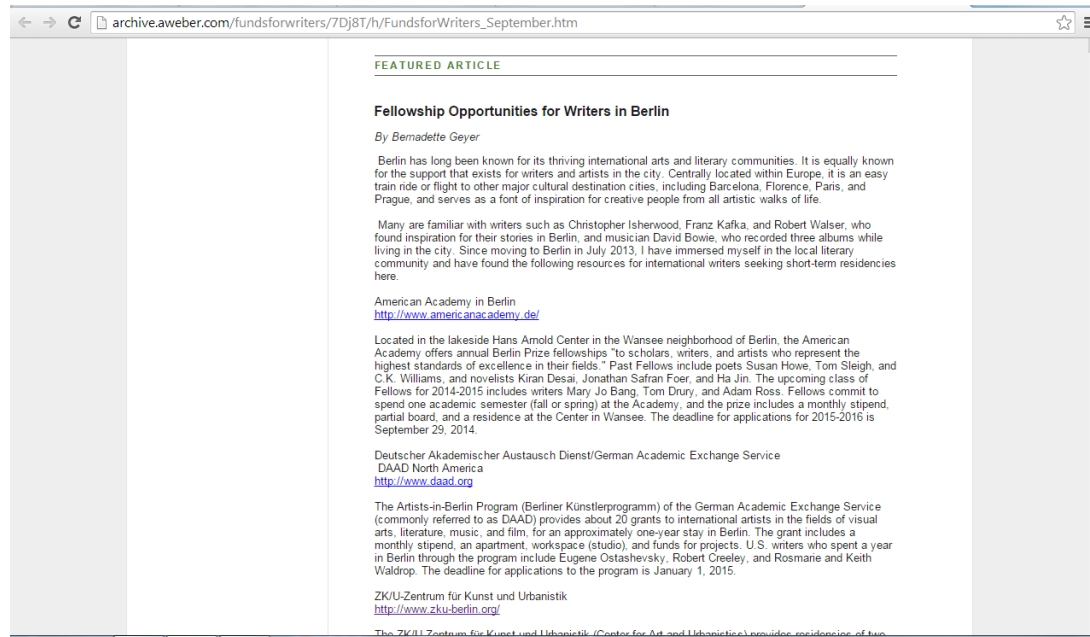
