WORKERS AT WARWICK HEALTHCARE CAMPUS VOTE FOR 1199SEIU

After a year of enduring a fear campaign by management, workers chose a unified voice to advocate for patient care and better jobs for the community

WARWICK, N.Y.—(October 31, 2008)—Healthcare workers at the three facilities that make up the Warwick Healthcare Campus voted yesterday to join 1199SEIU United Healthcare Workers East. A total of 121 workers from St. Anthony Hospital, Schervier Pavilion nursing home and Mount Alverno assisted living center cast their votes in favor of joining the union, while 118 workers voted no. There are also 11 challenged ballots that will be reviewed by the National Labor Relations Board, which is also investigating charges that Bon Secours administrators violated workers' rights through threats and coercion. Warwick is owned by the \$2.4 billion Bon Secours Charity Health System.

This narrow margin of victory came about despite a yearlong fear and intimidation campaign launched by Bon Secours. Workers said they were taken away from their patients' bedsides and pulled into anti-union meetings during working hours. Anti-union flyers that made use of religious imagery to denigrate the union were also posted throughout the facilities.

"With the intense pressure these workers faced, we congratulate them on taking this step," said 1199SEIU President George Gresham. "Their voices needed to be heard."

Brian O'Shaughnessy, Executive Director of the New York State Labor-Religion Coalition said, "All these workers are asking for is affordable healthcare for themselves and their families as well as basic economic security. We hope that Bon Secours will honor the workers' choice."

"We went through a lot this year," said Schervier Pavilion CNA Robin Matthews after the results were announced. "We fought and we won." Matthews implored Bon Secours management to respect their vote. "I want my rights. I want to be able to speak for myself. I want what the other 1199 Bon Secours workers have."

1199SEIU has a history of working with Bon Secours to ensure high standards of patient care and fair hospital funding. Examples include increasing training opportunities and participating in joint labor-management initiatives. 1199SEIU hopes the Warwick administration will respect the democratic choice of the workers instead of trying to undermine the vote through wasteful legal wrangling. Prior to yesterday's election, the Warwick facilities were the only ones owned by Bon Secours in the greater New York City area where workers did not have a union voice.
