OWENS & MINOR C.I.O. RICHARD W. MEARS OUTLINES SUPPLY CHAIN LEADERSHIP AT GREATER RICHMOND TECHNOLOGY COUNCIL EVENT

Richmond, VA -- Sept. 23, 2005 - Owens & Minor C.I.O. Richard W. "Rick" Mears addressed the Greater Richmond Technology Council "Good Morning Technology" breakfast event today, outlining the Fortune 500 company's technology-based strategies in supply chain management. Owens & Minor is the nation's leading distributor of national name brand medical and surgical supplies, and a healthcare supply chain management leader.

Stating that the technology goal at Owens & Minor is to extend innovation to its customers, Mears pointed out that technology is a linchpin of the company's supply chain management approach - 95% of the orders placed by their medical supply customers are placed and fulfilled electronically. Owens & Minor has developed software systems to facilitate their customers' supply chain needs such as OM Direct ™, an order management system; QSight ™ for inventory management; Product Manager ™ to streamline supplier and product management; and WISDOM ™ to handle supply chain analytics. The company has also introduced Alert Management, a system that facilitates constant process improvement.

Mears turned a dry, statistic-heavy subject into an entertaining presentation with an assist from Owens & Minor VP of Quality and Communications and "head cheerleader" Hugh F. Gouldthorpe, Jr., who was planted in the audience as a heckler. Together, Gouldthorpe and Mears illustrated the Owens & Minor team-mate culture, a key element in the company's success as a supply chain solutions leader.

Mears joined Owens & Minor in June 2005 after more than 15 years with Perot Systems Corp., a global IT business-solutions company, where he was the account executive for the Owens & Minor relationship from 1998 to 2003. When Owens & Minor outsourced its IT functions to Perot Systems in 1998, Mears oversaw the implementation of the 10-year outsourcing contract. He also helped lead Owens & Minor to #1 rankings in the InformationWeek 500 in 2001 and 2003.
