










Since '75 We Paved the Way!



Seventeen illustrious Founding Mothers of Latin and Caribbean backgrounds created Lambda Theta Alpha Latin Sorority, Inc. as the First Latina Sorority in the United States. The Sorority was founded in December of 1975 at Kean College (now University) in Union, NJ.

The Sorority's main purpose was to serve as a support group and network for Latinas and other women of color, empowering them to integrate into the social, political, and community service arenas that other students had been involved in.

In the Spring of 1994, a group of women were united in their vision to form a Sisterhood like no other, and found it in Lambda Theta Alpha. Nine of the ladies traveled to New Jersey and brought back Lambda Theta Alpha as the first chapter out of the tri-state region, the first in the South, the first in Florida and the first at UF. The Notorious Chi Chapter was founded on March 17, 1996.

It went to become a founding member of the Multicultural Greek Council and paved the way for many other organizations. Lambda Theta Alpha was recognized as N.A.L.F.O. Sorority of the Year in 2001, 2002 and 2004.

In 2003, Chi Chapter received national recognition when named the National Undergraduate Chapter of the Year by the National Association of Latino Fraternal Organizations (NALFO) and LatinoGreeks.com.
